



AIMS 3RD ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL REPORT CARD (RC3)

Covering school years 2000-2001 through 2002-2003

New Brunswick Francophone High Schools

Francophone schools in New Brunswick are assessed on a wide range of criteria. On the achievement side, provincial exam results in college preparatory French, history, mathematics and chemistry are used. Post-secondary achievement is used to complete the academic-achievement domain. On the engagement side, retention measures for all four high school grades, as well as participation in college preparatory math and French, are used in the assessment.

Overall, none of the schools are doing exceedingly well or particularly poorly. No school earned a grade above B+ or below a C. The leading schools are École Samuel-de-Champlain and École Marie-Gaétane, both earned B+ grades, with the former leading the rankings.

At the bottom of the rankings, École Régionale-de-Baie-Sainte-Anne and Polyvalente Clément-Cormier earned francophone New Brunswick's only Cs. Both schools earned these grades after achieving Bs in the last Report Card. Although still earning a respectable B, École Carrefour Beausoleil fell from an A to a B in this Report Card.
